



**Anchalee Chuthaputti, Ph.D.**

Anchalee Chuthaputti earned M.S. and Ph.D. in Pharmacology from Purdue University, Indiana, USA in 1986 and 1989, respectively, and B.Sc. in Pharmacy (First - class honors) from Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Chulalongkorn University, Bangkok, Thailand in 1982.

After her postgraduation, she started her job as a medical scientist in the Pharmacology Section, Medicinal Plant Research Institute, Department of Medical Sciences, Ministry of Public Health in 1989 and has been working here for 13 years. During working at Department of Medical Sciences, she received fellowships from different international organizations, e.g. WHO fellowship for the training on “The Use of Pharmacological Techniques for the Study of Natural Products” at the Central Drug Research Institute, Lucknow, India in 1992, fellowship from New Zealand Government for the training on “International Management” at the Institute for Executive Development, Massey University, New Zealand in 1997, and Korean International Cooperation Agency (KOICA) fellowship for “Workshop on Introduction of Korea Oriental Medicine” at Korea Institute of Oriental Medicine, Seoul, Korea in 2001.

She joined the Department of Thai Traditional and Alternative Medicine (DTAM), Ministry of Public Health in 2002 as a pharmacist at Institute of Thai Traditional Medicine (ITTM), and served as Deputy Director of ITTM for 10 years before becoming Director of Technical and Planning Division as well as Head of Office of International Cooperation, DTAM in 2017. She was also appointed Director of Institute of Thai-Chinese Medicine, DTAM in April 2018. Before retiring in 2020, Anchalee was served as Advisor in research and international cooperation of DTAM.

Owing to the fact that Anchalee is expert in pharmacology and toxicology of medicinal plants, herbal & traditional medicine with more than 20 publications related to such topics, after the retirement, she has been invited as a special lecturer of curriculums related to pharmacy from various schools and universities and a member of several expert committees. Additionally, she has been appointed Advisor in international cooperation of DTAM since 2022.
